Hawkes Bay North Island Champs Rounds 5/6 ... 8/9 July 2023

Both days were held at the famous HB Dartmoor Rd property of Mr McKenzie. HB first started riding there when his grandfather was farming the land. Then his father, now Alister McKenzie. Things are a little different there this year, after "all that rain" they had. Apparently 120,000 tonnes of silt were removed from the road that runs past the property. They were without electricity for 56 days. The bridges were gone so it was a very long way around to get out at all. They used a boat to get from house to house, floating around over the very same road that had the silt removed later. Horrendous! And the property has changed. Wow, has it changed. There used to be hundreds of sections, now there are thousands. And world-round sections by the dozen. There's canyons where there used to be just rounded-bottom valleys. And lots and lots and lots of new rocks!

It hasn't stopped raining up there, apparently. Everyone is sick of the rain, seem to get it every weekend. And so did we! The carpark turned into a bog in no time, really nowhere to

stand without your boots on. But we got on with it anyway, being trials riders and therefore salt of the earth. Actually it didn't rain much Saturday, it set in around when we had finished. Finish time was set at 2:30 for some reason, but everyone got penalty points so it was decided not to apply them. Good call.

The sections were set mostly on new slip material, perhaps to preserve what little grass Alister has left. It was not as bad as it looked actually. It looked like a proverbial bogfest but the mud is full of grit and there was a reasonably solid bottom on most of it. Not all, just most. All the same, the sections were "quite demanding" especially for the reds and yellows. Only Warren Laugeson and Kevin Pinfold finished under 100 points, and Kevin on 98. I'm pretty sure we didn't ride a single thing left over from before the cyclone. Many of those sections are either gone or FUBAR. But as I said: no shortage of new sections to ride, which was great.

Cam Judd and Carl Robson represented Ixion in Red, both on 130 points but Carl in 2nd place and Cam in 4th, with Phil Shilton between them also on 130. In yellow it was Wayne Furniss and Finn Pearce flying the flag, with 126 and 131 points, 4th and 5th. Just myself in Greeen, struggling hard in 9th. Zack Furniss and Gavin and Luke Pearce were there for us in Blue, 2nd on 35 for Zack, third on 58 for the Gavinator. Luke DNF'd unfortunately. In minis we had Ben Pearce cleaning up on 35 and Sebastian Robson third on 64 points. It was great to see Paul Symons riding at a trial again. For those who don't know he was NZ champ way back when Sidey and Johnny and KT were new in the sport, back when dinosaurs were still alive.

Day two there was no getting away from the rain. It was steady all day. No wind to speak of though. Today there were little rivers running through the carpark! Much easier to clean the bike though. That silty stuff is quite gritty and very sticky, so having rain helped a lot. I had to put new brake pads in the bike when I got home all the same, and strip the bike right back and wash it three times to get it in any semblance of cleanliness.

Sections were easier. Nobody over 100! Well done HB for easing them back. Cam roared up to third place on 55 compared to Warren Laugeson's winning 24. Well done Cam! Carl Robson 4th on 58. In yellow much the same, Wayne was 5th on 49, Finn 6th on 50. Last time to beat Finn eh Wayne? We shall see. I got a bit of mojo back to finish 5th on 19 points. Zack got 3 points all day for the win, Gavinator back in 4th on 12. Luke and Ben Pearce took aout 2nd and 3rd on 7 and 12 to Aksel McArdle's winning 4. DNF for Sebastian unfortunately.

So it was off the the newly-reopened Puketapu Pub for prizegiving in the warm and dry and back into the van to trundle happily home.

Conditions were difficult for sure, but it is after all called a TRIAL so no problem there. Top marks to Hawkes Bay for putting on a top class event that I personally will remember for a long time. It was one of the classics. Can't wait to ride Mr McKenzie's place in summer when the silt isn't mud!

The proceeds of the trial went to Mr McKenzie, and of 2 HB club trials, and there was a raffle which produced \$1300 plus a \$500 donation from Ixion club. I believe he was well stoked but I reckon for a 3 generation trials-hosting effort it's the least we could do. Well done to

all concerned, and as usual, if you weren't there how come? It was great!

or give me death....figuratively.



General Business:

1. Finn Pearce, Zack Furniss and Cameron Judd officially in the New Zealand Team to compete in Australia, September 2023.

It was agreed to support the teams application to apply to various charities to help fund the trip to Australia including an application to Pub Charity Limited for a grant of \$3563 to cover the costs of a New Zealand Team Mototrials riding uniform.

2. Obstacles in the clubs paddock at Maungakotukutuku Valley Road: It was agreed to construct some obstacles made out of tanalised timber for the minis to ride on. Kevin Tither to arrange.

Wayne has tanalised wood that he is happy to donate from an old playground structure.

Gavin has offered pine cut into 1m long sections.

Carl suggested concrete blocks.

Kevin to speak with GWRC ranger to obtain permission to install and arrange the obstacles.

Kevin will also arrange to remove and dispose of the toilet currently in the paddock as requested by GWRC.

3. Discussion around having the Tour de Judds to follow on from the Tour de North. Pros and cons on both sides

4. Discussion was had about the club reward scheme currently in place and whether it needed to be tweaked. To be discussed further with more consultation and propose changes at AGM.

5. MNZ AGM stated that clubs will need to reapply/re-register in October for their incorporation status and to update constitution. To be actioned next month.

6. Reminder to be put in Cycle Torque to renew MNZ licence (Shit's done – Ed)

7. Wayne Furniss is currently working on the 2024 Trials calendar. He has already communicated with Derek Scott (Sth Island) and Simon Houghton (Taranaki) to work with them.

(A lot of heavy-lifting in there, all of it voluntary and on our behalf and without a hint of kickbacks or nepotism...none. Huge thanks to our committee for all their hard work and conscientiousness - Ed)

Stumbled over a link in my "Might be Interesting" folder on measuring chain wear - <u>Measuring Chain Wear - Dirt Tricks</u> Its an interesting read but for those with a short attention span

- For 520 chain 100 links should measure 1587mm when pulled out tight, 1603mm is maximum wear.
- You should (at the very least) consider new sprockets at the same time.
- ring chain is heavier than ordinary about 100grams or an inch of coke in the bottom of the can but longevity in mud and stuff is a lot better. Check first before changing though as I believe some chain tensioner blocks are a bit narrow.
- He measured and calculated horsepower loss at somewhere around .01 at our speeds.

KP drew my attention to an article on the Radio New Zealand website <u>Motorbike riders</u> accused of creating a 'wild west' in forest park | RNZ. It is worth a read, a listen and even more worthwhile responding to. While I have some (not much, but some) sympathy for their anonymous interviewee some of his wants and suggestions are just rubbish. I was pleased with the support for the status quo by the GWRC and UHC people. Please consider contacting you GWRC representative <u>Greater Wellington Regional Council —</u> <u>Councillors (gw.govt.nz)</u> (if you can bear to wade through the Manglish) and make your thoughts on how much we value the park and it's access known. 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Cycle Torque is presented for the entertainment of the members and nothing herein is warranted to be factual or the opinion of the club or even of the person whose opinion it was at the time. Cycle Torque is generally published the week before the club's regular event, the wonderful <u>Ixion Club</u> <u>Trial</u>; which is generally held on the first Sunday of the month, rain hail or shine. Sections are set to cater from everyone from raw beginner to NZ championship "A" grade; something for everyone. Be there at 9am for a 10:00 start at the latest. Finish time is 3pm or when everyone is finished, whichever is sooner. There's time for quick lunch after the first round if you don't mess about too much. Cost: \$15 per rider, \$5 for students. Please bring \$5 notes and be aware due to insurance requirements that there is **NO RIDING AT ALL BEFORE YOU SIGN UP.**

DOGS are strictly forbidden at Trials because we ride due to the kindness of the farmers who own the land. Dogs make farmers unkind. The last 10 riders to sign in each get to bring in the pegs for one section. So turn up early if you want to leave early! See the President about this, the rules are not applied strictly. Brand new people can ride without an <u>MNZ license</u> for two trials; after that it is necessary to join MNZ (Motorcycling NZ), our national body. It's a cool hundred bucks a year, or \$130 for a champs licence, which is only necessary for Junior, President and Expert classes at Island or National level. In addition to the Club Trial, Ixion generally holds a two-day <u>North Island</u> <u>Championship Trial</u> each year, which is considered (by <u>all</u> Ixion members) to be the premier event in the World Trials Calendar. There are sometimes <u>Twilight Trials</u> during the summer starting at 3pm, often followed by a BBQ. The friendly <u>Committee Meeting</u> is held on the Tuesday after the Club Trial at the Lighthouse in Pauahatanui at 7:30 pm. Ring Kevin to make sure, before turning up. Club <u>fees</u> are \$40 per year and \$20 for fulltime students or social members, \$60 for families. These very reasonable fees are unchanged since the AGM, so pay up and as always ...
