Late permits are double fees as per Rule 4-1-1
Permit applications must be sent for approval to the District Steward for the area in which the event is being held. A stamped envelope, addressed to the NZACU must be included.

It may be necessary to institute a fee for Extra National meetings from 1-1-1990, depending on the outcome of Remits to the FIM Congress from NZ & Australia. We will advise all clubs further regarding the light cing system between NZ & Australia as soon as the FIM Congress in tober has been held.

Championships - Clubs allocated championships (see your Annual Report) are reminded that it is important to apply for permits at least sixty days prior to the proposed date of the championship, or double fees apply. Result forms must be returned to this office within 14 days of the event, signed by the District Steward and club secretary. You are also reminded that a District Steward must be in attendance at all championship events.




